Each scenario is named, and can be edited and formatted separately. It is essentially a saved set of cell values for your calculations. You can easily switch between these sets using the Navigator or a drop-down list which can be shown beside the changing cells</p> <p>ii. Goal Seek: It is used to calculate a result based upon existing values. Using Goal Seek option under Tools menu, we can discover what values will produce the result that we want.</p> <p>iii. Solver: It is more elaborated form of Goal Seek. The difference is that the Solver deals with equations with multiple unknown variables. It is specifically designed to minimize or maximize the result according to a set of rules that we define.</p> <p>iv. Subtotal: SUBTOTAL is a function listed under the Mathematical category when you use the Function Wizard (Insert > Function). Because of its usefulness, the function has a graphical interface. SUBTOTAL, totals/adds data arranged in an array—that is, a group of cells with labels for columns and/or rows. Using the Subtotals dialog, you can select arrays, and then choose a statistical function to apply to them. In Base, data can be linked between two or more tables with the help of primary key and foreign key constraints. Referential integrity helps to avoid:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Adding records to a related table if there is no associated record available in the primary key table. • Changing values in a primary if any dependent records are present in associated table(s). • Deleting records from a primary key table if there are any matching related records available in associated table(s). <p>2. Many to Many Relationship In this relationship, no table has the primary key column. It signifies that all the columns of primary key table are associated with all the columns of associated table. Example: In the given tables EMP and DEPT, there is no primary key.</p> <p>4. Foreign key (FK): identifies a column or set of columns in one (referencing) table that refers to a column or set of columns in another (referenced) table. The “one” side of a relation is always the parent, and provides the PK attributes to be copied.
